#### Dear HNS Friends,

Woven through this Annual Report are the stories of 2020, a challenging and unforgettable year. What is shared on the following pages will confirm in your hearts why you believe in and support the mission of HNS. The statistics will paint the picture that affected so many members of our communities. Brought together, the story and statistics tell the story of how HNS was able to respond to the need with the help of our donors.

Because of your support, HNS has been a lifeline for thousands of individuals and families in crisis. Together we stabilized households with basic need services, provided parental resources, served men, women, and children experiencing homelessness, and much more.

As a cooperative agency of the Larimer County Emergency Plan, it was essential that HNS continue to operate across all programs. We closed for one day in mid-March to strategize a new plan of operations. Without much information or understanding of what to expect, we moved our services outdoors or through ZOOM to provide the safest deliverance of services. Through rain, snow and blazing sun, the HNS team, both staff and limited volunteers, were committed and steadfast. They worked longer hours and joyfully served every person who came through our drive-through service lines. This approach made it possible for even the very at-risk people to receive assistance. As time went on, we adapted multiple times to keep up with the growing needs, especially the drastic increase in first-time clients. None of this could have been possible without all of you faithful, faithful donors! I am so proud of the entire HNS team and our deliverance of vital resources!

We have launched into 2021 positioned to fulfill the mission of bringing help for today...and hope for tomorrow. It is with joy and thanksgiving that we invite you to celebrate House of Neighborly Service's "milestone" year. It is going to be a busy year, yet one of great celebration.

As a human services nonprofit, the mission of HNS has not changed in 60 years; we exist to meet the emergency needs of those in crisis, right here in our local community—serving individuals and households that are within the Thompson School District. This is how HNS served in 2020:

### **Basic Needs Programs**

#### FOOD PROGRAM

- Distributed 6,547 food baskets
- Provided groceries for 272,782 meals
- Valued at **\$549,927.66**

#### **CRISIS PREVENTION**

- Prevented 589 utility shut-offs
  \$388,986 total utility assistance
- 42 people received prescription assistance
  2,869 total assistance
- 160 people received transportation assistance
  \$2,335 total assistance

#### CLOTHING

- 21,829 items were distributed
- 1,607 people served

## **Family Advocacy**

#### PARENTS AS TEACHERS (PAT)

- 26 households received parent education
- Serving 62 children ages 0-5

#### FAMILY TO FAMILY

- 110 families received advocacy for crises
- 218 children were served

#### **Homeless Programs**

- **222** people received services, including 132 children, through:

## Wrap Around Services

- **200** children and **42** organizations received back to school supplies
- **74** Berthoud households received Thanksgiving Food Baskets
- Christmas Program:
  - 3,471 toys were given for 634 children
  - **79** households in Berthoud received Christmas Food Baskets
  - **451** households in Loveland received Christmas Food Baskets
- Referrals, educational classes (parenting skills and financial literacy) dance classes for children, auto repair, and more
